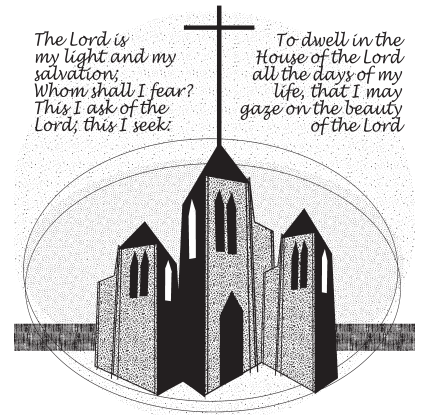

At the end of his Encyclical on the Sanctity of Human Life, Pope John Paul II closed with a prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary:

“O Mary, Mother of the living, to you do we entrust the cause of life. Look down, O Mother, upon the vast numbers of babies not allowed to be born, of the poor whose lives are made difficult, of men and women who are victims of brutal violence, of the elderly and the sick killed by indifference or by misguided mercy. Grant that all who believe in your Son may proclaim the Gospel of Life with honesty and love to the people of our time. Obtain for them the grace to accept that Gospel as a gift ever new, the joy of celebrating it with gratitude and the courage to bear witness to it, to the praise and glory of God, the Creator and lover of life.”

From The Pastor's Desk

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will be from January 18th to the 25th. We focus on the words and the will of Jesus Christ who prayed the night before He died, "That all may be one as you Father and I are one." An important idea expressed by Pope John Paul II is that the unity willed by God can be attained only by the adherence of all to the content of revealed faith in its entirety. We cannot alter the deposit of faith, changing the meaning of dogmas, eliminating essential words from them, accommodating truth to the preference of a particular age or suppressing certain articles of the Creed under the false pretext that they are no longer understood today.

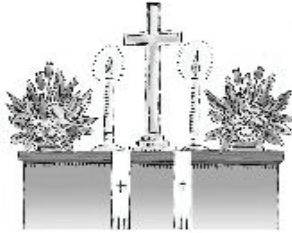
At this time of year, we also focus on the **sanctity of innocent human life**. Yesterday (January 22) marked the day that the U.S. Supreme Court issued in 1973 its Roe vs. Wade decision that declared unconstitutional any and all laws prohibiting abortion. The sanctity of innocent human life is one central truth that is not only part of God's revealed truth but is clear from the point of view of science and common sense. The fact that there is such disagreement about this is a sad reminder of how far we are from the unity that God desires. Tomorrow (January 24) is the March for Life in Washington, D.C. If you are not going, say a prayer for the safety of those traveling and that God change the hearts of all to accept and protect His gift of human life.

These two ideas of Christian Unity and Respect for Life intersect in many ways. We don't have unity and we don't have respect for life because people don't accept God's truth. A sad example of this is a popular commentator on cable TV who says that the child in the womb is only a "potential" human being. He is very proud of his *No-Spin Zone*. In doing this, he gives aid and comfort to those who profit from the extermination of babies.

Every human being begins life in only one way, from the union of a woman's egg and a man's sperm and science confirms that the life that begins at that moment can never develop into anything other than a human being. Refusing to acknowledge the full humanity of the child in the womb will eventually lead to denying the full humanity of any person whose life becomes too inconvenient, too expensive, too unproductive. Once a human being can be justifiably eliminated at one stage of life, he can be eliminated at any stage of life. Once the sanctity of life is put up for grabs, no one is safe.

The truth is not elusive or hard to comprehend but requires courage and determination to defend. The truth shall make you free.

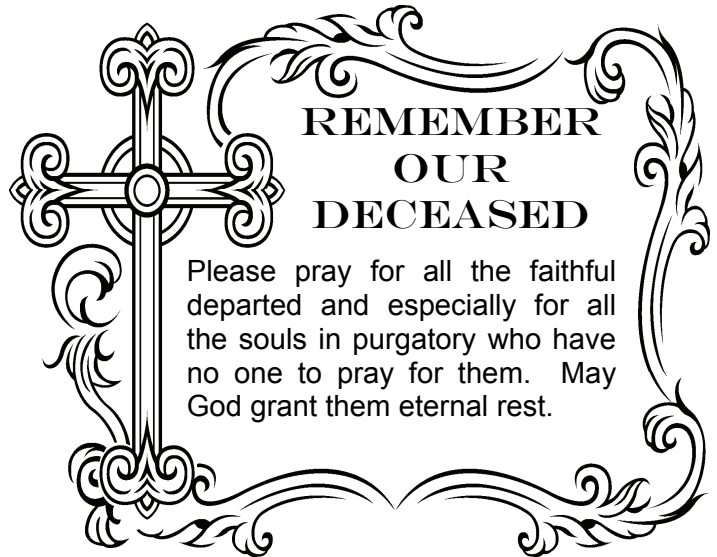

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Is 8:23 —9:3 / 1 Cor 1:10–13, 17 / Mt 4:12–23 or 4:12–17



What makes you drop everything you're doing and pay full attention to something else? The smell of cookies burning in the oven? The crack of glass from the living room window that happened to block the path of a young boy's baseball? The holler of "Come quick!" from your child—or is it silence from your child's room that indicates mischief is occurring?

It's usually an emergency of some sort that draws our attention so quickly. But do we ever respond to God so dramatically and immediately? The Gospel today tells us that Peter, Andrew, James, and John responded with immediate haste to Jesus' call to follow him. They left everything behind—so urgent was Jesus' draw on their hearts. Their priorities suddenly shifted.

When was the last time you felt your priorities shift so urgently in the direction of the Lord? So often, focusing on our relationship with God and taking time to listen to God's whisper falls fairly low on our priority list. Contrast this image with that of devout Muslims, who stop in the midst of their daily tasks to drop to the floor, face Mecca, and pray to Allah. They do this five times a day. In those moments, nothing takes their attention away from the priority of prayer and worship of God.

As we look at what fills our days, is there room for God to get in? Does it take an emergency for us to pay attention to God, or do we hear Jesus' call to follow him every day, in the ordinary moments of our lives? Perhaps today we can drop everything to reorganize our priority list—and reconnect with God.
