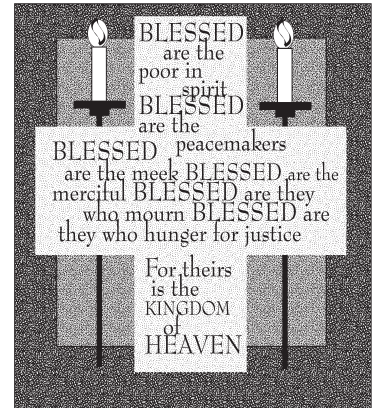

## *From The Pastor's Desk*

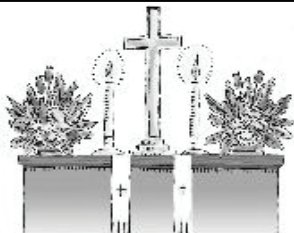
**The Word of God:** Throughout the year, and certainly during Holy Week, we are encouraged to read, study, meditate on, and live the Word of God. The Scripture readings that we hear read at Mass have done a marvelous job of opening up more of the Bible but since we only hear a relatively short selection taken out of context, we can be confused. A few years ago, I found an excellent book that is very helpful in making the Word of God a familiar part of our spiritual life. The title is *Inside the Bible – An Introduction to Each Book of the Bible*. The author is Fr. Kenneth Baker, S.J. and it is published by Ignatius Press. Each chapter is devoted to a different Book of the Bible; there are 73 books in all. Each chapter has the same sections: The place (of the Book) in the Bible, the date and author, the theme, a summary, the theology and, finally, an outline. I have ordered and have available a limited number of these books if you are interested. They are \$15.00 each. If you can name 10 Books of the Bible, I'll give you the book for \$10. The book will not answer every question about the Bible but at 374 pages, it provides quite a bit of information. I'm sure you have heard that the Bible is the best selling book of all time. Have you read it? much of it? any of it??

*“Sow for yourselves righteousness, reap the fruit of steadfast love; break up your fallow ground, for it is the time to seek the Lord that He may come and rain salvation upon you” (Hosea 10:12).*

### **Did you Know...?**

- that God Himself is present in our Church?
- that the actual Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is present?
- that Catholics who know this and believe this show it by making a sign of respect to Our Lord present in the tabernacle?
- that the proper sign of respect is a genuflection on the right knee or a bow of the head if unable to genuflect?
- that the statues, vigil lights and Stations of the Cross are traditional signs and symbols of persons and ideas close to God but that these are lifeless and cannot be compared to the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle?
- that respect for others who are praying in Church should be shown by refraining from loud talking or laughing?

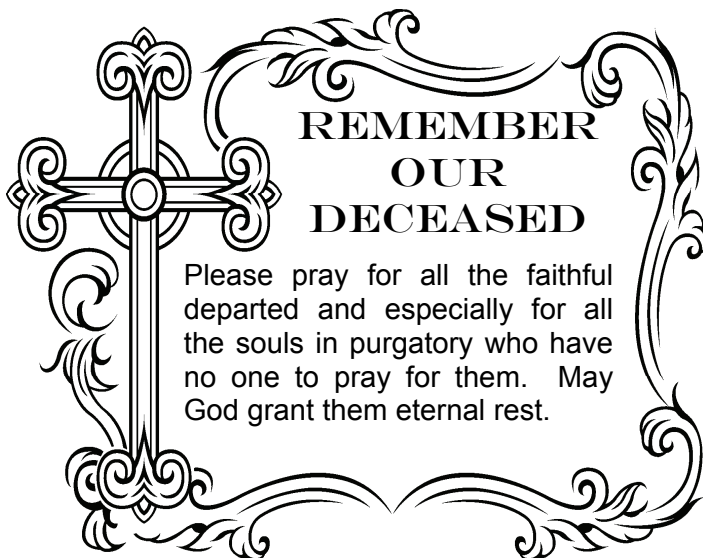

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Zeph 2:3; 3:12-13 / 1 Cor 1:26-31 / Mt 5:1-12a

*The old Rabbi said, "In olden days there were people who saw the face of God."*

*"Why don't they anymore?" a student asked.*

*"Because nowadays no one stoops so low," the Rabbi replied.*

Our culture treasures height. We tell children, "You've gotten so big!"

We nag teenagers to stand up straight. We celebrate promotions. We want to stand tall and reach high.

And there's nothing wrong with that, but the Rabbi echoes the very different message in our readings today—that it's not the standing tall that brings us closest to God, it's the stooping low. Zephaniah describes a humble remnant particularly close to God, and Paul says God consistently chooses to reveal the divine through the weak and broken. Today as Jesus begins his Sermon on the Mount, we hear the familiar Beatitudes, Jesus' mind-boggling statements that declare the lowliest as "blessed."

Most of us have felt "stooped low" while mourning a loved-one's death, struggling with illness, or living with heavy emotional burdens. Many are stooped low by poverty, war, and oppression. Though we often try to move quickly through mourning and illness or avert our eyes from the homeless person in front of us, we are challenged to remember that God is most present in humble moments of struggle and suffering—moments in which we are indeed stooped low.

But what if we didn't rush grieving and healing? What if we accompanied someone in an illness or took a moment to converse with that homeless stranger? Blessed will we be—for we will see God.

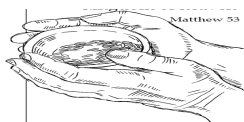
**Holy Name of Jesus Giving Tree Project**
