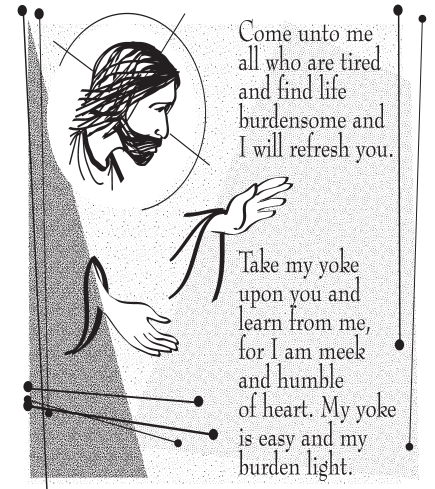

## *From the Pastor's Desk*

**Peter's Pence Collection:** That is the name given to the annual collection which we had last week as our second collection. The proceeds from that collection are sent to the Holy Father (the successor of St. Peter, the first Pope) to enable Pope Benedict to meet various church needs. It enables him to offer assistance to victims of natural disasters anywhere around the world. He is able to help the poor and needy whether they be children or the elderly. The Holy Father uses this money to help very poor Dioceses with the work of education, evangelization and ongoing pastoral work.

The practice of providing material support to those charged with preaching the Gospel is as old as Christianity itself (cf. Acts of the Apostles 4:34, 11:29). This gesture of helping the Holy Father to meet the needs of the universal Church is not only practical but has a strong symbolic value. We join together as the Catholics that we are; we are part of a universal Church and so we act accordingly. The Church can never be exempted from practicing charity as an organized activity and at the same time each individual is called to charity. We must not only respond to the demands of justice but also to those of charity.

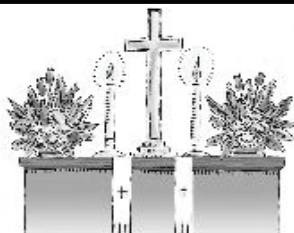
There are ever increasing demands on the work of the Church. The ever present poverty of certain areas of the world is increased by the global economic problems that now affect the world. Requests for aid come not only from mission lands but from other unexpected sources. Many expect the Apostolic See over which the Pope presides to give them the support they often fail to find elsewhere.

The previous Sunday, June 19<sup>th</sup>, was **Father's Day**. Many of you put in the collection the names that you requested be remembered in our Father's Day Novena of Masses. You also included your special offering in conjunction with your request. I thought about these two ideas of the Father's Day Offerings and the Peter's Pence collection and I have decided that *Father's Day* was also the *Holy Father's Day*. Therefore, the money you donated for our Father's Day Novena will be included with what we collected in the Peter's Pence collection and it will be sent to Pope Benedict for all his charitable work. Thank you for your generosity in these two and all our many collections.

**The Fourth of July** celebrates, as we well know, our national freedom. The *Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church* answers the question "What is freedom?" by saying that "freedom is the power given by God to act or not to act, to do this or to do that, and so to perform deliberate actions on one's own responsibility. The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. Freedom attains its proper perfection when it is directed toward God, the highest good and our beatitude. Freedom implies also the possibility of choosing between good and evil. The choice of evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to the slavery of sin."

**The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church** answers many other questions about our Catholic Faith and is on sale in the rectory. Every Catholic home should have a copy of either the Compendium or the Catechism itself – or both.

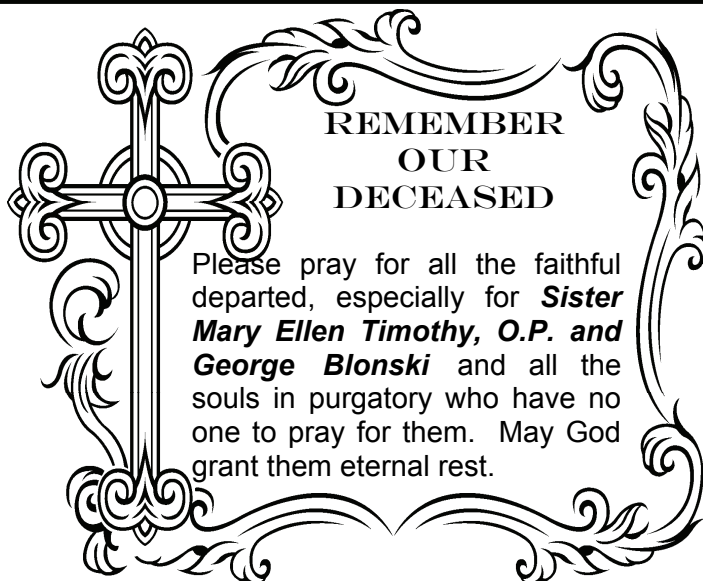

**FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Zec 9:9-10 / Rom 8:9, 11-13 / Mt 11:25-30

Have you been praised lately for being childlike?  
When was the last time someone complimented you on your meekness?  
These aren't particularly praiseworthy qualities in our culture. Yet, as you might guess, we're challenged to emanate these qualities in today's Scriptures.



Despite having lifelong exposure to these Scriptures, I continue to be amazed at the contrast they offer to the values we treasure in our culture. On this weekend in which we celebrate the independence of our country, the greatness of our nation, and the strength of our democracy, the Scriptures paint a picture of meekness, dependence, and humility. Zechariah prophesies about the humble Israelite king who will bring peace to war-torn lands. Jesus praises his Father for revealing wisdom to those who are dependent and receptive like children. And Jesus himself is described as "meek and humble of heart"—and we are instructed to learn from him.

Where do we need to learn meekness and humility? Perhaps we have puffed-up self-images that need reshaping. Do we ever forget we're not God? Maybe we've claimed credit when it ultimately is owed to God. And what about ourselves as a country? While independence, strength, and freedom are wonderful values to celebrate, where might we as a nation grow in dependence, receptivity, and humility?

Meekness, humility, dependence—they sound like easy virtues, but in reality they're among the most challenging to practice. Yet our ultimate model of such a virtuous life is never far from us. Jesus is present to us in the Scriptures, and he has promised to share our yokes in life. He accompanies us always; our challenge is to follow the path he has modeled for us.
