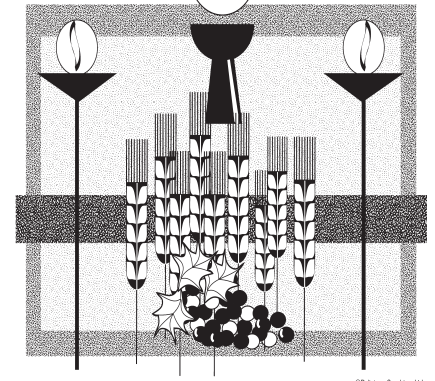

From the Pastor's Desk

Banners-Thank you: As you enter the church for Mass, you may have noticed that the banners over the tabernacle and side altars change periodically from season to season. Five sets of banners were originally hand made by a committee of parishioners approximately 10 years ago. The large fish (a classic Christian symbol) on the back wall of our church, depicting the many names of Jesus in different languages, was also done by this committee. **Joe and Ilene Michitsch along with their daughter Kathy Aufiero** were a large part of the committee from planning to implementing these beautiful banners. Each year since then, Joe has faithfully been coming to take down and put up the appropriate banners for the particular liturgical season we are in. As with many ministries in our parish this work is quietly done. We commend and sincerely thank Joe, and those who assist him, for their dedication, time and effort in this labor of love for the benefit of beautifying our parish worship space.

Wyandanch Soup Kitchen: We again come to you with an appeal for the soup kitchen in Wyandanch. It has come to our attention that supplies continue to dwindle and more canned or boxed foods are needed to be able to feed the large number of people coming on a daily basis. If you can commit to this ministry, a list of items is below for your consideration. If each of us brought a can or box each week, we would be able to supply the kitchen on a more consistent basis. Large cans are of particular need.

Items to consider:

Canned chicken/turkey or spam, tuna fish, peanut butter, vegetable oil, vinegar, salad dressings, pasta, pasta sauce, canned or dry soups, rice, cold cereal, jellies, snack foods, juice, coffee/tea, boxed shelf milk, baby food and formula, canned vegetables and fruit, sugar, canned milk, and other non-perishable food you may wish to contribute.

At this time, there is a special need for dry-mix drinks such as *Kool-Aid, Instant Ice Tea and Dry Milk*.

We also continue to accept all baby and children's clothes, baby and toddler items, children's books, personal items, i.e., toothpaste, deodorant, lotions, tooth brushes, shampoo and conditioner, especially trial size.

We have been told many times how grateful the soup kitchen is for the assistance they receive from our parish. We are grateful for all your help to make life a little easier for those in need.

Announcing: Loving Memorials in *The Long Island Catholic*

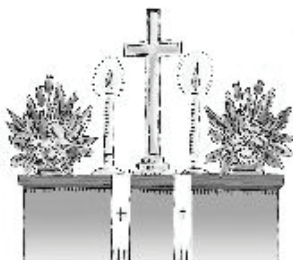

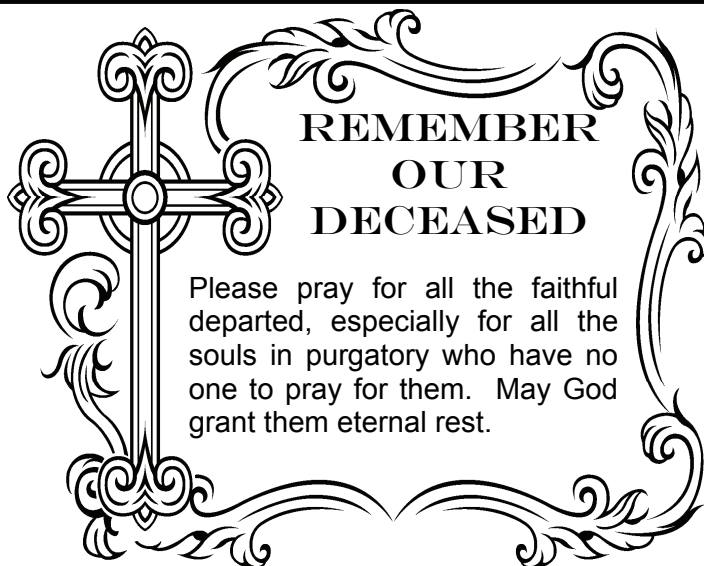

MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dt 8:2-3, 14b-16a / 1 Cor 10:16-17 / Jn 6:51-58

My house is a veritable Museum of Bread Makers. Before our marriage, I knew my husband loved to make bread, but I didn't know about his penchant for accumulating electric bread makers. They seem to magically appear in our home, as do the loaves of bread. Coming home to the smell of fresh bread, I discover not one, not two, but three loaves on the counter. The biblical multiplication of the loaves occurs in our kitchen regularly.



Ron is also a bread aficionado at work. He's known for baking fresh loaves in his office bread maker just in time for that midafternoon slump. The wafting aroma of fresh bread draws everyone out of their offices to share butter-slathered slices. Even the most calorie conscious can't seem to resist a healthy slice of warm, doughy goodness.

Bread has that effect—it brings people together. The bread and wine we share in the Eucharist do the same, as we hear in Paul's letter today: "Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf."

The Eucharist not only profoundly unites us with God, but it also binds humankind. One of my most powerful liturgical experiences is watching the community procession to receive the bread of life and the cup of salvation. Everyone brings forward individual joys, burdens, gifts, and brokenness, with open hands and mouths, to receive the Lord's nourishment. Through the Eucharist, we are deeply united, all coming in need of God and each other.

The next time you celebrate the Eucharist, take a moment to experience that connection. Then let that unity flow through the church doors—into the parking lot, into the workplace, into your neighborhood. Be a bread maker, bringing people together with the nourishing love of God.
