From the Pastor's Desk

New Roman Missal: At the 5:15 p.m. Mass on Saturday, November 26, 2011 we will hear for the first time the new translation of the prayers of the Mass. Catholics will be asked to use the new wording in their responses that will essentially be the same.

One important idea to keep in mind is that this is an event that affects the world wide Church. It is ultimately the work of the Holy Spirit that is intended to make our liturgy a better expression of our faith and hopefully will enable us to understand more deeply the wealth that is contained in all the prayers that the Church directs to Almighty God.

Incidentally, a good part of my recent vacation was and always has been my experience of the universal character of the Catholic Church. I can go into any Catholic Church and be welcomed to concelebrate the same Mass that we are familiar with at home. Any Catholic, while traveling, can find the opportunity to participate in THE Mass, the CATHOLIC Mass; granted, there will be small differences but that's normal.

There will be parts of the new translation that some will not understand, others will not like and still others will reject. That will be a big mistake; the Mass has been given to us by the Lord specifically to bring us together and that, obviously, means that everyone will not be able to do things their own way. It's like driving; if you want to go out to the Salt Flats of Utah, you might be able to drive as fast as you want and go wherever you want but if you want to drive the L.I. Expressway from here into the City, you better keep between the guidelines and obey speed limits and other traffic laws. If you want to go into your room and close the door and pray to God, He will be most happy to hear you talking to Him using your very own words and ideas. He will see your good intentions and know exactly what you're trying to say to Him. When you come to Mass, however, you will be part of His family, the Church, and He will want to hear the prayers of the Church.

It's also important to know that this is not an imposition of a few people in the Vatican. The work of translation has been going on for almost a decade and has involved people around the world. Much consultation has taken place and there has been a truly democratic element in the whole process where the Bishops have had the opportunity to discuss and exchange their views and then vote on the various versions that have been proposed along the way. The results will benefit the Church for generations to come.

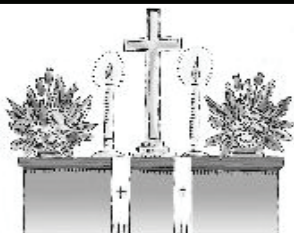
Diocesan Mass on Pentecost: As part of the preparation for the introduction of the new Roman Missal, Bishop Murphy announced that there would be a Mass **on Pentecost Sunday, June 12, 2011 at 3:00 p.m. at St. Anthony High School Athletic Center on Wolf Hill Road and Pigeon Hill Road in South Huntington.** The purpose is to invoke the Holy Spirit on our Diocese as we prepare to begin using the new Missal. Everyone is invited to come to participate in this Mass.

Directions to St. Anthony's High School

Northern State Parkway: (Eastbound) To Exit 41, Wolf Hill Road (S. Huntington/Dix Hills). At the STOP sign turn left (South Huntington). Pass the first traffic light and at the second traffic light, there is a double right turn, take the 2nd right turn onto Pidgeon Hill Road. Saint Anthony's is on your left. Please park in the large parking area behind the school.

Northern State Parkway: (Westbound) To Exit 41, Wolf Hill Road. At the STOP sign turn right (South Huntington). Pass the first traffic light and at the second traffic light, there is a double right turn, take the 2nd right turn onto Pidgeon Hill Road. Saint Anthony's is on your left. Please park in the large parking area behind the school.

Long Island Expressway L.I.E. 495 East: to Exit 49N Route 110. Travel North on 110. At the 4th light after exiting the L.I.E. turn right on Old Country Road. Take Old country Road (about 2 miles). At the second traffic light, there is a double left turn, take the second left turn on Pidgeon Hill Road to St. Anthony's which is on your left. Please park in the large parking area behind the school.

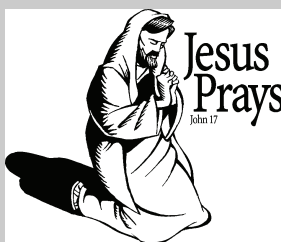

**June 5, 2011****SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER:** Acts 1:12-14 / 1 Pt 4:13-16 / John 17:1-11a**Ascension of the Lord:** Acts 1:1-11 / Eph 1:17-23 / Mt 28:16-20

It's a time to feel empty. Normally, I wouldn't encourage this. But imagine how Jesus' disciples felt—first, devastated by his death; next, overjoyed at his resurrection and presence with them; and then, left confused and empty as Jesus departs a second time when He ascends to His Father.

Military families know this emotional roller coaster: initial sadness as their soldier leaves for a foreign land, immense rejoicing when the soldier returns for a two-week leave, intensified sadness when the brief visit ends. Others know similar feelings when a child graduates and moves away or begins a new life through marriage, or when a spouse dies after a long illness.



Sometimes we seek to fill moments of emptiness with TV, shopping, gambling, or food. But the Ascension readings challenge us to stay with the emptiness for a time. Life teaches us that endings lead to new beginnings. We know that next Sunday, on Pentecost, we will celebrate a beginning—the birth of the Church—that could have occurred only through Jesus' departure.

But the time between endings and beginnings can feel quite empty.

Though nothing can truly fill those empty moments, we can take comfort in our community of family, friends, and parishioners. In the days after Jesus' departure, the disciples remained together, supporting and upholding one another. A community of faith can do much to sustain us through days of emptiness. They can remind us of Jesus' final words in Matthew's Gospel, which are of ultimate comfort—"I am with you always, until the end of the age."
