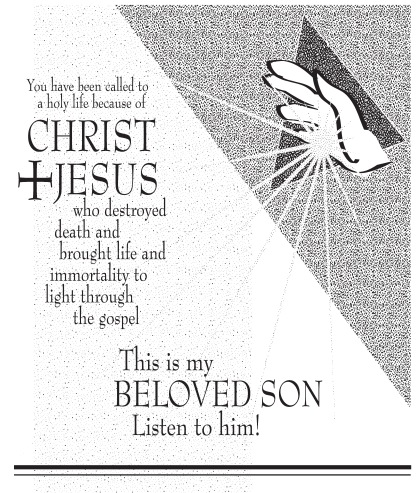

GUIDELINES FOR THE RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

For Catholics

As Catholics, we fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when we receive Holy Communion. We are encouraged to receive Communion devoutly and frequently. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord without prior sacramental confession except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (*Code of Canon Law, canon 916*). A frequent reception of the Sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

For our fellow Christians

We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in the Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (*John 17:21*).

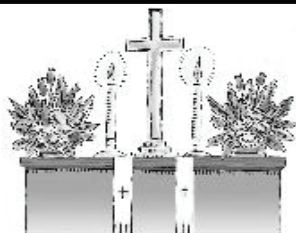
Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. Eucharistic sharing in exceptional circumstances by other Christians requires permission according to the directives of the diocesan Bishop and the provisions of canon law (*canon 884 § 4*). Members of the Orthodox Churches, the Assyrian Church of the East and the Polish National Catholic Church are urged to respect the discipline of their own Churches. According to Roman Catholic discipline, the Code of Canon Law does not object to the reception of communion by Christians of these Churches (*canon 884 § 3*).

For those not receiving Holy Communion

All those who are not receiving Holy Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with the Lord Jesus and with one another.

For non-Christians

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus Christ. While we cannot admit them to Holy Communion, we ask them to offer their prayers for the peace and the unity of the human family.

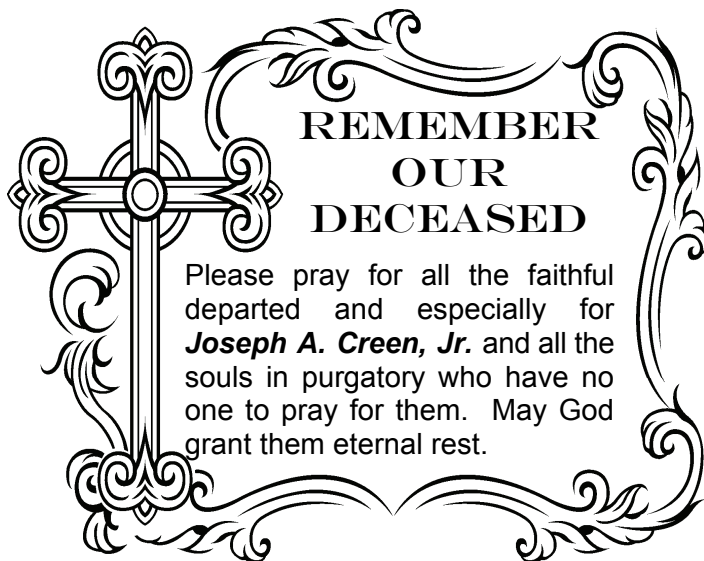

**March 20, 2011
SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT**

Gen 12:1-4a / 2 Tm 1:8b-10 / Mt 17:1-9



I used to live in an apartment with a basement laundry area. In the dim light from the basement windows, it *seemed* fairly tidy. However, if you flipped on the lights, you'd be overwhelmed by the number of stringy, sticky cobwebs enveloping the corners and ceiling pipes. I'm a fairly courageous woman, but cobwebs leave me feeling less than brave...OK, let's just say it: afraid!

In Matthew's version of Jesus' transfiguration, he emphasizes the disciples' great fear. I'm not surprised—seeing Jesus transfigured must have been quite shocking. But I wonder if they weren't so much afraid of who Jesus was revealed to be—fully the Son of God—but rather, who *they* were revealed to be—broken sinners hardly measuring up to Jesus' brilliance.

Did they perhaps sense the sinful betrayal they would later exhibit at Jesus' crucifixion? In the stunning light of Jesus' goodness, our own weaknesses and brokenness are revealed like cobwebs in the corners of our souls. Perhaps we turn a blind eye to them in the dim light of every day, but when faced with the brightness of the One we're to emulate, the stringy webs are impossible to avoid and can be frightening to behold.

Yet, like Peter and James, we are not alone. When we take time to look clearly at our cobwebs of sin, Jesus touches us, too, and says, "Do not be afraid." Jesus accompanies us when we attend to the brokenness in our lives—our persistent patterns of anger, our inability to forgive, our struggle to love as Jesus loves.

If we reach for Jesus' touch—during Lent or at any time—we can find the courage to sweep away the cobwebs and shine with the divine light found inside us too.
