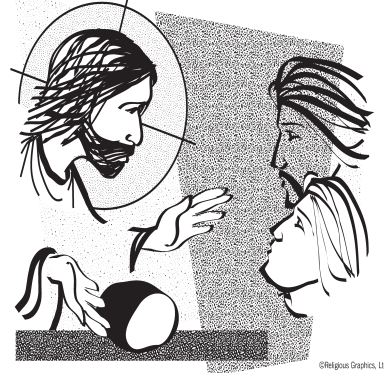

From the Pastor's Desk

New Roman Missal: Blessed John Paul II announced a revised version of the *Missale Romanum* (the Roman Missal) during the Jubilee Year 2000. The *Roman Missal* is the book used in the celebration of Mass. In the United States, the *Roman Missal* is published in two different books: the *Lectionary* contains the Scripture readings and the Psalm responses and the *Sacramentary* contains the prayers said mostly by the priest during Mass.

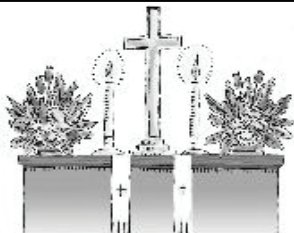
The revised edition of the *Missale Romanum* contains prayers for the observances of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Votive Masses and Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, and some updated and revised rubrics (instructions) for the celebration of the Mass. The English translation of the *Roman Missal* will also include updated translations of existing prayers, including some of the well-known responses and acclamations of the people.

There is a new translation into English of the part of the New Roman Missal that we now know as the *Sacramentary*. **We will begin using this on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26 and 27, 2011.** The entire Church in the United States has been blessed with this opportunity to deepen its understanding of the Sacred Liturgy and to appreciate its meaning and importance in our lives.

There are various websites that can serve as reliable resources for all interested in learning more about the Sacred Liturgy. One of these is www.dignumetiustum.blogspot.com. Now is the time to seize the opportunity given to us for all Catholics to **deepen, nurture and celebrate** our faith through the renewal of our worship and the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy.

Diocesan Mass on Pentecost: As part of the preparation for the introduction of the new Roman Missal, Bishop Murphy wrote a Pastoral Letter entitled "Belong More Deeply." In it he announced that there would be a Mass **on Pentecost Sunday, June 12, 2011 at 3:00 p.m. at St. Anthony High School Athletic Center on Wolf Hill Road and Pigeon Hill Road in South Huntington.** The purpose is to invoke the Holy Spirit on our Diocese as we prepare to begin using the new Missal. This liturgy will be an opportunity for all of us to gather together, invoking the Holy Spirit and celebrating the great gift of our faith and the community of faith here in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. Everyone is invited to come to participate in this Mass.

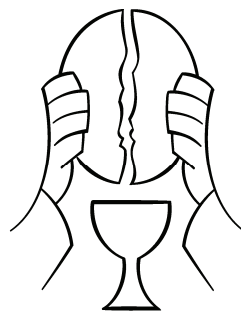
THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 2:14, 22-33 / 1 Pt 1:17-21 / Lk 24:13-35

As we read the stories of Scripture, we can find it either easy or difficult to identify with the characters we meet. We can readily find ourselves in today's Gospel story of the two sojourners on their way to Emmaus. Perhaps we haven't dined with Jesus or experienced him vanishing before our eyes. But haven't we all experienced something that later turned out to be quite different than what we thought?

These two believe they're simply meeting a fellow traveler as they hike back to their home-town of Emmaus. They're quite open in their conversation with him, sharing their previous expectations of this man Jesus and how unsettled they are by recent events in Jerusalem.

In a gesture of hospitality, they invite the stranger to stay and eat with them. This turns out to be no ordinary meal: Jesus reveals himself in the breaking of the bread, and they finally see who this stranger truly is. They see the experience they've just had as something completely



different from what they thought it was; God was at work in the most ordinary of experiences.

We too catch glimpses of God moving and transforming us. An illness, a job change, a difficult conversation, a chance meeting with a stranger - all of these look like one thing in the moment but later we see how God was moving in those moments to heal, strengthen or grow us.

Like the Gospel travelers, we must foster an openness, a hospitality of heart, to be able to see these workings of God more clearly. The Easter season challenges us to keep our eyes open to see Jesus, our constant traveling companion.
