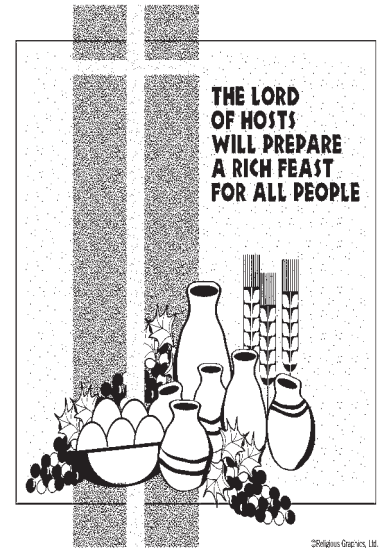

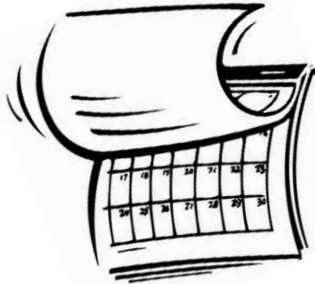

## *From the Pastor's Desk*

**The Lord be with you!** Who could want a more beautiful greeting than that? If the Lord is with us, who could ask for anything more? We are familiar with these words from the Mass and our response is so ingrained and automatic – however, we gotta change it. The new translation of some of the words of the Mass will begin in less than two months. Perhaps the most obvious change which we will be asked to accept will be the new response to “The Lord be with you.” The response will be **“And with your spirit.”** Not only is this a more accurate translation of the Latin “*et cum spiritu tuo*” but there are very good reasons for this wording.

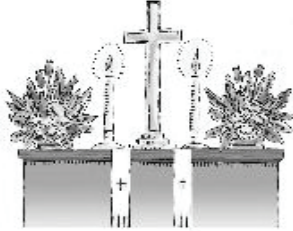
What is my “spirit”? What is your “spirit”? The general idea is that our “spirit” is what we do believe in, what we are aiming for, but at this point in our lives, it’s more than we have actually achieved. I think back to many years ago when I was going to Chaminade. Again and again I was reminded that we had to have “School spirit.” Chaminade High School had then when it was only 25 years old and has today much more “School spirit.” It has its memories of all its alumni who have excelled in so many ways and have made such great contributions to society, to the Church, to their own families and on and on. Every young man who goes there is challenged to use and develop the gifts God has given him so he can make his own contributions throughout his life. He is part of something much bigger than himself.

School spirit is very real and important but at Mass we’re talking about something much bigger and much more important. One of my favorite authors is Father Karl Adam who wrote a book called “*The Spirit of Catholicism*.” It has become a book that I will continue to go back to again and again and re-read and gather new and deeper insights into my Catholic Faith. The spirit that we are referring to when we say *The Lord be with you*. *And with your spirit* is the ideal for which Holy Mother the Church works and to which God our Creator draws us. Many people have achieved this ideal which is different and unique for every individual. Many people have become saints and there are many different kinds of saints. Fr. Karl Adam in his book says,

*“How exceedingly various are the forms of saintliness. By the side of the saintly hermit stands the social saint. By the side of the foreign missionary stands the saint who gave his life to cripples, or the mentally ill, or criminals condemned to the gallows. By the side of the saint who is arrayed in a robe of penance stands the saint of the world. By the side of the saint of the strict enclosure and constant silence stands the joyous friar who calls the swallow his sister and the moon his brother. By the side of the saint of divine learning stands the saint who despises all knowledge save that of Christ. By the side of the contemplative mystic, the world conquering apostle. By the side of the saint who does penance in filth and rags stands the saint robed in imperial purple and crowned with the glory of the tiara. By the side of the saint who fights and is slain for his faith stands the saint who suffers and dies for it.”*

May the Lord fill us with His spirit and be with us as He promised until the end of the world.

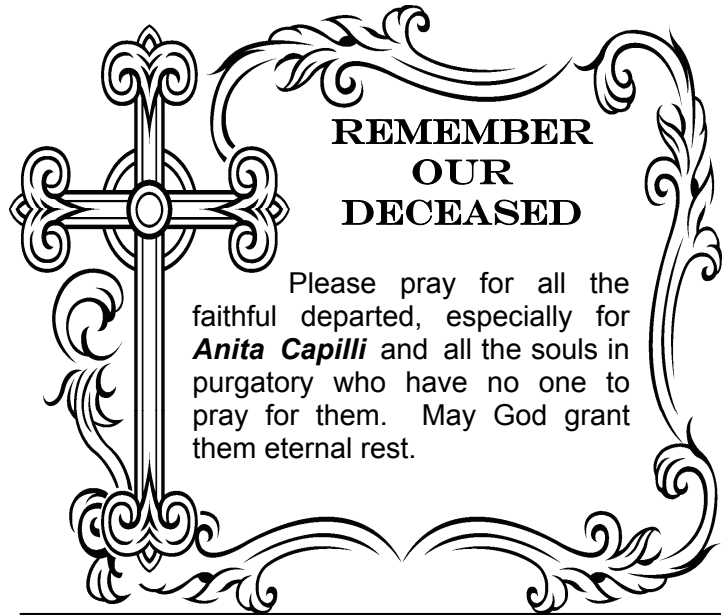

**October 9, 2011**

**TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Is 25:6-10a / Phil 4:12-14, 19-20 / Mt 22:1-14 or 22:1-10

Sometimes Jesus' words can seem quite vague to us; at other times, he makes his point with extreme clarity. The latter is the case today. For the past three Sundays, Jesus has used parables to indict the religious leaders for their self-righteousness, their assumption of God's favor, and their rejection of Jesus. Today he compares them to wedding guests who decline their invitation to attend. Some must see to more important matters; others believe they needn't attend because they're already in the host's good graces.

The story doesn't end well for them, and outsiders accept the invitations. Jesus indicates the religious leaders can't slide by in the Father's eyes—salvation is guaranteed to no one, especially not to those who reject the Father's invitation.

We might too easily dismiss this story as one that doesn't apply to us. We wouldn't reject an invitation to God's banquet. Yet don't we often put other responsibilities and activities before our relationship with God? Don't we sometimes take God's love for granted? "God can't possibly expect us to live as Christians 24/7." "That little lie I told isn't so bad." "God always forgives us, right? We don't have to try that hard."

If those thoughts sound familiar, we have more in common with the invited wedding guests than we thought. Our response to God's invitation should be an ongoing, daily response rather than one given only when it's convenient. We have important responsibilities every day, but we can't accomplish any of them without God—a truth Saint Paul echoed in our second reading: "I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me." With *these* words first on our lips, we can *repondez, s'il vous plaît* (RSVP), to God's invitation with a resounding yes—and renewed commitment and conviction.
