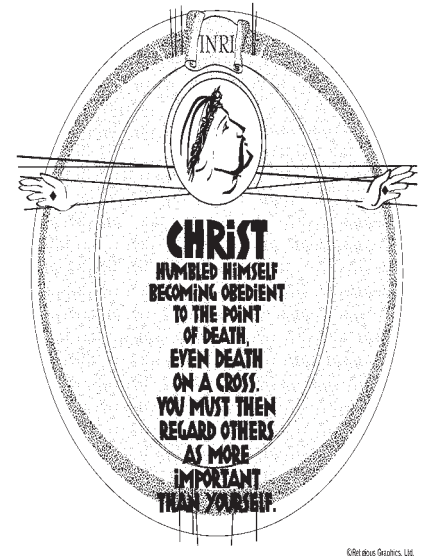

for refreshments and hospitality.*

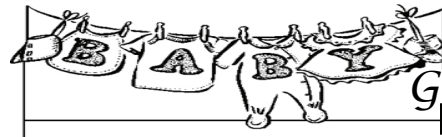




Happy Birthday Spiritually Adopted Baby

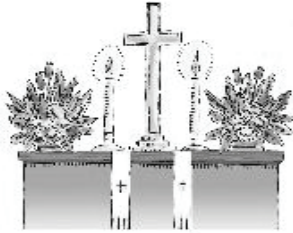
We, as Catholics, are one of the largest groups of people who stand up for life. We ask that you search your conscience and make every effort to make an appearance.

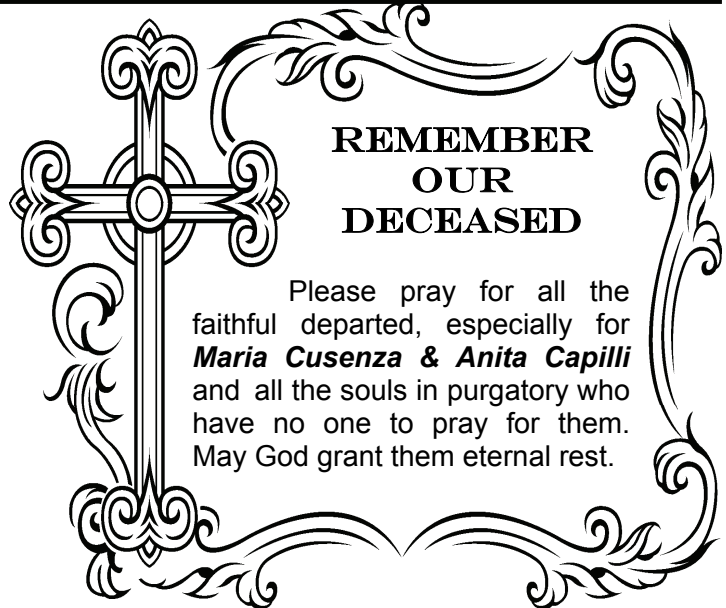
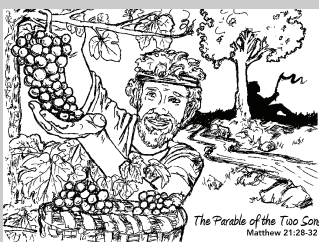

**September 25, 2011****TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Ez 18:25–28 / Phil 2:1–11 or 2:1–5 / Mt 21:28–32

Anyone who has played a sport involving a ball knows the importance of follow-through. Coaches repeat this lesson to their players: Stopping your leg when it touches the soccer ball won't result in a long kick. Swinging a bat partway around won't carry the ball far. To score the goal or hit the home run, you have to follow through with your leg or bat.

Today's Gospel is all about follow-through. A father asks his sons to work in the vineyard. One son says "Heck, no!" but then does the work. The other son says, "Sure, dad!" but doesn't get off the couch. One son follows through; the other doesn't.



Sometimes we say an enthusiastic yes to God on Sundays, but that yes lacks follow-through after we leave church. Do we share the Sign of Peace with fellow parishioners but nearly run them over in the parking lot after Mass? Do we sing "Holy, Holy, Holy," but on Monday gossip about our coworkers? Do we come to the eucharistic table where people of all races and genders are welcome, but then on Wednesday exclude one of them?

Our follow-through is always incomplete, but that's why Christ—our model as well as our savior—died for us. That's why we should keep trying to follow through. As Saint Paul reminds us, Jesus is God's yes to us—he emptied himself and became human, showing us how to live with faithfulness to God, even to death.

In other words, he followed through.

St. Pius X Enriched Living Facility ***"Caring for those who cared for us"***

Today is the **special collection** for retired priests, living at St. Pius X Enriched Living Facility.

There are currently more than 100 retired priests in our Diocese. Many live independently in parishes or their own homes. A smaller group requires intensive medical support and is lovingly cared for in skilled nursing home facilities. Many require assistance with daily living and St. Pius X Enriched Living Facility provides that extra care and attention, while still allowing these priests to serve as active, fully engaged members of the community.

It is important to differentiate between this special collection and the Retired Religious Collection. The Retired Religious Collection, held annually in June, supports the retirement needs of religious brothers and sisters who have served our Diocese. It does not provide for the retired needs of our Priests.

We welcome your support of this important endeavor.
